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Submission Process

Click on the Submit for Congress 2022 link on orthonurse.org.

Carefully follow the online directions when submitting presentation proposals; incomplete proposals will be disqualified. It is the responsibility of the submitter to assure the online proposal is complete.

Submission Deadlines

Podium Presentation Proposals are due by **July 20, 2021**

(There will be no extension date; notification of acceptance/decline by October 2021).

Poster Presentation Proposals are due by **September 20, 2021**

(There will be no extension date; notification of acceptance/decline by late November 2021)

Podium Presentation Proposals

Podium presentation proposals require:

- Title
- Learner Need or Practice Gap
- Detailed Summary of Content
- Measureable Learner Outcome
- Minimum of 3 references
- Completed [Bio](#) and [EPT](#) forms

Research podium proposals additionally require background, problem and purpose, methodology, sample, results, limitations, conclusions, and implications.

Poster Presentation Proposals

Poster presentation proposals require a title, purpose, one outcome (“The learner will...”), a summary of the content, and [completed bio forms](#).

Research poster proposals require the above AND background, problem, methodology, sample size, results, limitations, conclusions, and implications.

A proposal can be for either a podium or poster presentation, but not both. NAON does not accept any presentation or poster with bias or product promotion. Travel and housing arrangements are the responsibility of each presenter

All Presentation Proposals

There can be no more than two (2) physical presenters per poster or three (3) physical presenters per podium presentation.

Reviewers score proposals using the following criteria:

- Proposal appearance and completion
- Outcomes/objectives and content
- Orthopaedic innovation
- Evidence-based practice
- Relevance to orthopaedic nursing
- Support for Congress learner outcomes
- Educational level
- Track and topic, as well as number of same topic submissions
- Category A or B
- Free of product/drug bias
