GRAB BREAKFAST TO GO AT FARROW

Farrow has some of the best sandwiches in the city! In the first 10 months that they were open, they served over 100 different sandwiches. They have three locations throughout the city and are open 7 days a week!



HEAD TO ELK ISLAND NATIONAL PARK

Forty-five minutes east of Edmonton lies a wild oasis. The perfect place to day-hike, canoe, camp or spot some bison. Elk Island National Park is also a designated dark sky preserve and the cornerstone of Canada's bison conservation.



CANOE ON ASTOTIN LAKE

Elk Island is a wonderful place to explore both on the land and on the water. Haskin Canoe offers canoe, kayak and stand up paddleboard rentals (north end of beach area) for your exploring pleasure at Astotin Lake.



LUNCH & FREE TIME AT THE UKRAINIAN CULTURAL HERITAGE VILLAGE.

History is brought to life at the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village, an open-air museum where costumed role-players recreate the life of early Ukrainian pioneers that settled in east central Alberta from 1892-1930. Step back in time to hear real stories of hardships and triumphs in Canada's oldest and at one-time largest bloc settlement of Ukrainian pioneers.

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
TAKE IN A FESTIVAL


EXPLORE THE ROYAL ALBERTA MUSEUM
